Foundation's Weekend

Encouraging students to streangthen their spiritual foundations one step at a time.

This year, we had several staff and faculty speak into the students' lives. Pastor Tim Case, one of EBIC's theology professors and pastor of Covenant Life Church in Henrietta, NY spoke on the divine importance of the Lordship of Jesus Christ. Pastor



Tim Fuest, EBIC's Associate Dean of Students and pastor of New Testament Church in Perry, NY encouraged the student body to get plugged in to a church where they could be baptized in water. Dr. Fred Antonelli, EBIC's President, wrapped up the weekend speaking on being baptized in the Holy Spirit, as well as breaking the bondages that are holding students back in their faith.

Each student is moved differently throughout the weekend, as he or she works on creating a solid foundation in their walk with Christ, before diving into the rest of their time at EBIC. Some students may have already been baptized with water and in the Spirit, but have not fully accepted the Lordship of Christ, as well as letting go of the bondages that are holding them down. Others may have accepted the Lordship of Christ, but have never taken the step to be baptized in water. Other students may have heard each message several times already throughout their years at Elim, but may feel like they are hearing and receiving the lessons taught for the very first time.

Through each of these moving sessions filled with worship and a powerful word, the students are led through the necessary steps to ensuring a solid spirutal foundation. Each student enters the weekend with uncertain expectancy, not fully understanding how powerfully they will be changed. New Business Certificates

Earn a one-year certificate that will greatly benefit your career!

Continuous learning is important in the workplace. However, returning to school for four or even two years might not be realistic for many people. This is why certificate programs have become a popular way to quickly learn necessary skills.

In fall 2023, EBIC started offering a distance education Business Certificate program. This online certificate program is twelve credits (four classes) in length and can be completed in two semesters. Students who enroll in the program will get the quality of an undergraduate education, with a track of study specialized for what they need. Since the courses are delivered in an online, asynchronous format, they are perfect for busy, working adults. The Business Certificate can even be transferred into one of EBIC's other degree programs if the student decides to continue their studies.

Currently, the four Business Certificate tracks available are: Launch a Non-Profit Organization, Business Management, Marketing Strategies, and Church Administration. Each track targets specific, practical business skills such as understanding fundraising and marketing, developing administrative

skills, analyzing financial statements, managing projects, resolving conflict, and strategic planning. The faculty teaching the courses are successful Christian businesspeople with relevant experience.

EBIC recognizes the value of godly individuals practicing biblical principles in the business world. It is our belief that Christian workers are an essential part of God's manifested kingdom on the earth. Jesus said in Matthew 5:16, "In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven" (English Standard Version).

Acquiring solid business insight to produce high quality work is a practical way to demonstrate God's standard of excellence and bring glory to his name.
