

REMEMBERING STACY CLINE



Our beloved Stacy Cline entered into Glory on Friday, March 4, 2022. Stacy was born to Roger and Marion Cline in Johnson City, NY on April 23, 1949.

Around 18 years old Stacy Cline made the decision to have a committed relationship with Jesus. After reading Jeremiah 15:16, he became consumed with the desire to study Scripture and enrolled at Elim Bible Institute as a full time student.


Stacy married the girl of his dreams on September 21, 1968. In his own words, Connie won his love, heart, and deep

respect with her uncompromising commitment to Christ, unshakable maturity, and emotional stability. He was a stronger man in Christ because of her love and partnership. In 1974, Stacy and Connie were called to minister at EBIC. For 25 years Connie was a key administrator in the Dean of Students office, and Stacy described working and ministering with her as a blessing. Stacy served as the Dean of Students and was a popular teacher at EBIC. He was known for his deep love for people and provided pastoral care for many. While he taught classes on Biblical Theology and was an incredible scholar, Stacy was most known for his Marriage and Family class, which he and

Connie taught together for many years. Stacy continued to minister at EBIC right up until his passing, totaling over 48 years of service at the school.

Stacy is survived by his loving children, Danielle Cline (Dustin Novitzki), Michelle Sandwell; grandchildren, Katherine, Daniel, Anna Joy, and David. Stacy was predeceased by his beloved wife Connie E. Cline; daughter, Rene Sandwell; granddaughter, Jessica Grace; and son, Douglas Sandwell.

The following is a collection of memories by Dick Grout, a current faculty and friend of Brother Stacy.

When I came to Elim Bible Institute in the fall of 1977, Stacy was my favorite teacher. As a young believer who was also called to be a teacher of the word of God, I learned a great deal from Stacy's approach, the authenticity of his life, and his dedication to research and preparation. Little did I know that in 1989 my family and I would return to the Elim



campus, and I would have the honor of working with my former teacher, now as a colleague and a fellow instructor. A few memories from our many years together stand out to me.

In one of the first classes that I had with Stacy he taught from the book of 1 Peter that there are manifold or various trials that we need to go through. And that same Greek word used for 'various' is later used to refer to the various or manifold grace of God. For every trial that we will ever go through, there is a corresponding aspect of the grace of God to take us through that trial. I have

always remembered that concept but certainly did not know at the time how Stacy's life would model it to me over and over again.

Stacy and I co-officiated at the wedding ceremony of his daughter Rene and Doug Sandwell. It was quite a bonding moment for both of us to be nervously excited before the service began.

One beautiful Fall day several years ago, we were at an EBI school picnic at Mendon Ponds Park. During the picnic our daughter came in contact with a 12,000-volt electric line while climbing a tree and fell, unconscious, to the ground. As we came running to her,

we found Stacy laying on the ground next to her head, watching her and caring for her. We will always cherish that picture in our mind of Stacy's fatherly care for our little girl (who, miraculously, survived!).

For several years, Elim Gospel Church asked us to minister together at their Good Friday service. Stacy would preach and teach the story of the crucifixion, and I would lead worship interspersed through his comments, and bring our attention to the cross of Jesus. It was a very meaningful


time for both of us and I miss those opportunities to minister together with my brother.

I recently discovered an extra copy of the book Heaven by Randy Alcorn and felt to give it to Stacy. As we both were working our way through that mammoth book (he much more quickly than I), he told me several times that it was meaningful to him to learn more about what scripture says about heaven. And now he is truly an expert in the subject!

I found Stacy to be compassionate and sympathetic. He was a friend and an encourager. Every time I walked by his office, he had a kind word and a smile for me. He was a good listener and a true confidant: whatever you shared with him was tucked safely away in his large father's heart.

Stacy was strong, and I can still see him as a younger man running down College Street in his Syracuse orange sweatsuit. He was a gentle man, but when he hugged me, I felt I was being embraced by a human tree trunk.

I love him and will miss him. We all will. Until we see him again.

STACY CLINE SCHOLARSHIP


This scholarship is in honor of Elim's long-term Dean of Students and teacher:


- 1. Must be full-time, live on campus, enrolled in either AAS in Biblical Studies or BS in Theology

- 4. Must be involved in the community/church in some capacity
- 5. Must have a financial need.

Elim Bible Institute and College is a proud partner to Helimission. This past fall, we had the honor of hosting three different families from Europe who are being trained to join the Helimission team in the field. We were so blessed to have them as a part of our EBIC family, even if it was just for a short time.

The following is from Helimission's website, and gives a deep description of who they are, and what they do:

"Helimission's aim and purpose is to provide social, medical and spiritual aid to people in remote and inaccessible areas. Helimission is non-denominational and helps those in need regardless of their religious affiliation.

"We currently operate three helicopter bases with a total of 6 helicopters: two bases in

Indonesia, on the islands of Papua and Sulawesi, and one in Madagascar.

"From our bases, we support local organizations in the bush by flying provisions for them. In addition, we transport building material, medicine and medical equipment to supply and maintain bush hospitals.

"Furthermore, we fly medical personnel into remote areas to provide treatment and preventive care to the local inhabitants. Many of our flights are to rescue emergency patients and accident victims."

As of 2022, EBIC has upgraded its equipment with a 32-channel digital snake, choir mics, and livestream equipment. This has enabled us to host professional worship teams, livestream our President's Chapel and special events, and most importantly we have been able to provide our students with opportunities to learn and grow in managing: livestream, worship teams, projection, and mixing live sound. Our hope for the upcoming years is to upgrade our passive



OUR FIRST BACHELOR'S DEGREE!



For many years Elim Bible
Institute functioned as a nonprofit
organization offering a three-year
diploma. Elim was not recognized
as a higher education institution
in New York State. As such, our
students were not able to apply for
any grants, and transferring credits
from Elim to other Christian
colleges became increasingly
difficult. At the very beginning of
the 21st century, Elim leadership
together with the board of
directors recognized the need
for change.

As a result, Elim Bible Institute

and College (EBIC) was registered as a higher education institution and in 2012, it was granted a provisional charter from the NYS Board of Regents granting Elim permission to conduct programs leading to an Associate degree. It still had to work on meeting the standards of accreditation, which was a very daunting task. In 2013 Rev. Michael Cavanaugh, the president of EBIC at that time, decided to create an office of institutional effectiveness for this very purpose. That's when I was invited to join the Elim team. We all agreed that while the academic and organizational standards had to be strengthened and EBIC as a college had to become more efficient, Elim could NEVER lose its PRIMARY focus of training Christ-centered and Spirit-empowered servant leaders. Instead, it had to find a way to



Romans 12:1 states, "I appeal to you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship." Notice that Paul talks about worship without any kind of musical form. Even though music is an expression of worship, it is not the essence of worship. Worship is beyond music. Paul makes it clear in verse 2; "Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect." Worship is giving God the glory that He alone deserves. Worship begins in our hearts; it is our way of living, our daily actions, choices, thoughts, and words. They should bring glory to God. That is the heart of worship.

Music is simply a tool created by God and given to us to help us do that. We can't be excellent worshippers unless our hearts and talents are centered in glorifying Jesus Christ. Worship Music is not

While wandering around the streets looking for people to pray for, we met a man who was going through terrible times. His clothes were torn and he had scars all over his legs because of drugs. We asked if there was any way we could pray for him. He told us how he desperately wished he could be free of his addictions and how he felt trapped. We prayed for him, and I asked if he had a Bible. He did not. I asked if he wanted one. We weren't equipped to hand out

Bibles on that particular night, so the only one I had with me was my personal Bible. I will never forget the way he held on to it when I handed it to him. I will never forget the look of gratitude and hope.

Feeding people is excellent and necessary. Helping them financially is a tremendous ministry. What really matters though is that they hear God's Word, that they are given the good news of Jesus Christ. I handed the man a sandwich, and it gave him sustenance. I handed him a Bible, and it gave him hope. How are we ministering to people? Are we only feeding their bodies, or are we also feeding their souls?
