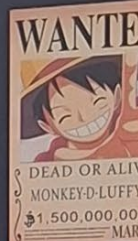
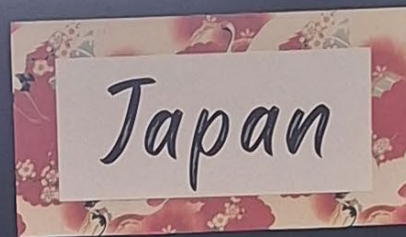
by, but we are also legally recognized as Elim Bible College.

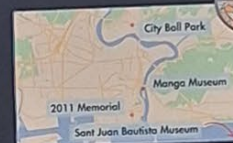

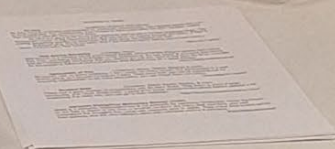
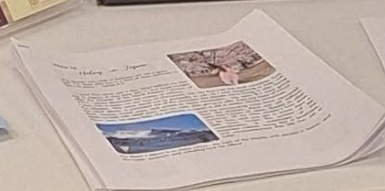

Missions Emphasis Week

The theme of Missions Emphasis Week this past Fall semester was “*to the ends of the earth*” based on Acts 1:8.

Brother Harry Vellekoop kicked off our opening session with a message on bringing **closure** to the Great Commission. He traced the Great Commission back to Genesis 12:3, with God’s promise to Abraham that “all the families of the earth will be blessed through you.” He demonstrated with a vivid object lesson the great need for missions to focus on completing the Great Commission by focusing on bringing the Gospel to the three billion unreached people groups who have yet to hear and respond to the Gospel!

Brother Tom Brazell continued in the second session, speaking on our **response** - “Here I am” - here I am to worship (Romans 12:1); here I am to listen (1 Samuel 3:1-10); and finally, here I am to go (Isaiah 6:1-8)! Brother Clem Ferris continued on Thursday morning speaking on the theme, “**Acquiring Spiritual Sight**”, drawing from the account of Jesus healing a blind man in Mark 8. He challenged us to seek to set our spiritual vision beyond where we are! Finally, Clem closed with a session on the topic,



“**Nations Prophetic Perspective**”, through the lens of a proper understanding of the sovereignty of God (Isaiah 6:1).

Other highlights from Missions Emphasis Week include hearing from our international students representing the world - from Ghana, Kenya, Congo, Liberia, Mexico, Sri Lanka, Singapore, and Poland. Prayer is also always an important element. This year, we dedicated time during one of the sessions rotating around to different stations set up in the Tabernacle representing various regions of the world. Finally, students also had the opportunity to visit with some amazing missionaries from various fields as well as missions’ organizations. And of course, we cannot forget the international food that our Dining Hall staff prepared for our students!

May the flame of global missions continue to burn bright and strong at Elim. In the words of Elim’s founder, I.Q. Spencer, in *Willow in the Wind*, “The visitation of the Holy Spirit **must carry a world vision**, or it shall stagnate like other movements” (cited in Meloon, p. 165).

A Roller Coaster Ride through Suffering, Loss, and Grief

A Sweet Relationship Began

I entered Elim Bible Institute (EBI) in 1974 as a very shy and lonely freshman. I had been raised by my father, along with four other siblings. My biological mother was never around in my life. Fortunately, through a neighbor who believed all the kids in the neighborhood should go to Sunday school, I learned about Jesus and gave my heart to Him at age 15.

When I entered Elim in 1974, Ruth Rodriguez (“Mom”) became my advisor. She was one of the kindest individuals I had ever met, and the hurting little girl inside me was drawn to her. Over the next three years at Elim, we got to know each other and a precious relationship grew. That relationship eventually turned into a mother-daughter relationship that lasted many years. She could not have been a better mom if she had given birth to me. She was a gift from our Heavenly Father, and I am who I am today because of her life and unconditional love.



Roller Coaster Ride

I never could understand anyone’s fascination with roller coasters! You wait in line for what seems to be hours. Once seated, a bar will come down over you, and you realize there is no turning back. The ascent begins slowly as you anticipate—either with excitement or fear—that first drop. The first incline is not the only one you will experience. There are more inclines with just as many dips—along with some curves thrown in to make it more “interesting.” Depending on the type of roller coaster, some of these curves take you upside down, making you wonder if you will remain in the seat or fall to your demise on the ground hundreds of feet below. Although the ride may last no more than 90 seconds, it seems like forever. When it stops, you are left breathless.

I recall only one time when Mom rode a real roller coaster. It was at the insistence of her niece and nephew, who wanted their Aunt Ruth to enjoy something they enjoyed. Mom found herself seated next to her younger brother, a bar coming down over her whole body, and wondering, “What in the world am I doing?” All she could do as the ride began was to scream, “Help me! Help me!” Later, her brother winsomely asked who she expected to come help!

In April 2003, I found myself waiting in line for another type of roller coaster ride that I really didn't want to experience. But once I got in the seat, there was no turning back. My hope was that there was an end in sight, and all would be well.

This last ride I took with Mom was similar to that first roller coaster ride. We rode it together, not for 90 seconds, but for five months. During those five months, there were many ups and downs and curves that left us hanging on to each other for support. One day we would be told something that gave us hope. The next day I would find myself asking the question, "What are we doing here?" as I wondered if we would survive this ride to the end.

Mom's first symptoms had been aches and pains, feeling tired, and back pain that got increasingly worse. Tests showed that she had pancreatic cancer—a cancer that is not easily diagnosed until it is too late to be treated and cured. Not wanting her to be alone at night, I slept on her couch for over four months, caring for her. I worked during the day but came back at night. In the last seven weeks of her life, a nurse came in the morning, and staff at Elim volunteered to stay with her during the afternoon.

Throughout the five months that Mom suffered, she never wavered in her trust in the One who was the Master Controller for this ride. She remained steady, trusting in the One who was in charge—the One to whom she had given her life completely. The night she passed, I found it hard to let her go. I was the one hanging on to her for dear life, wishing the ride would stop and we both could walk away into the sunset. But this I knew: God is Sovereign, and He has established the length of our days—and I trusted Him. When Mom's ride stopped on September 26, 2003, at approximately 3:15 a.m., she walked away into the arms of Jesus. I had to get off the ride by myself and walk into what I thought was total darkness.

After Total Darkness

Mom taught me much of God's grace during her illness. I am grateful I got to accompany her through her last roller coaster ride to the end. But, in my mind, a roller coaster is still running. There are ups and downs and curves thrown in for me to respond to. I no longer have Mom to hang on to, so I'm learning to put my trust totally in the Master Controller. Other



people are on the ride with me, surrounding me with love and doing what they can to help me get through this process of grief. I am mourning, but not as those who have no hope, for the Lord is my comfort.

Will there be another roller coaster ride for me? I don't know the answer to that question, but I want to be ready should the Lord ask that of me. I believe that how I respond to this loss in my life will determine how I weather the next ride. As I have tasted the bitterness of sorrow, I desire to have the sweetness of the Lord in my spirit. Mom's life exuded the sweetness of the Lord. My desire is that I can follow the example she gave me and live my life for Christ as she lived her life.

In my worship, I surrender my life to God. I give Him my fears concerning my future and depend completely on Him. I wait for His comfort. In Him, I rest.

Ruth Rodriguez imparted her love for Christ and the world to her students during the 36 years she served at EBI. Many of those students are in distant countries today using what she taught them to reach the nations. The words "The World Was in Her Heart" are inscribed on a bronze plaque at the base of the Memorial Globe dedicated to her honor at the 2004 Missions Conference on the campus of Elim. The Globe is a challenge to the students at Elim to worship the God that Ruth loved and served—and to share His love with the world.

Potential students, especially young people, may not care about the specifics of a program or the intricacies of financial aid, but they will jump at the chance to encounter Jesus. As important as recruiting is, Elim has always had the most success connecting with people through ministry and God experiences.

One way this happened, led by the great Dick Grout, was a ministry team humbly called Servant. For

years, Servant was a key connection point with churches, remembered and loved by many as a representation of the life of Elim. Well, as Brother Dick recently said to me, “It’s time.” My wife, Bridget, and I have been working with Dr. A, and I am honored to reintroduce **Servant**, coming back this fall!

Our ultimate purpose is to grow the Kingdom of God. Elim pursues this purpose by training servant leaders for ministry. As part of Elim, Servant’s outward-facing role is to bring more people to Elim to be trained and transformed. How? By ministering at churches, bringing the life and power of Elim out of them - to you! Within the school, Servant’s inward-facing role is to play a part in developing the students we have. Put the right students in position to do ministry, and they will grow with ample opportunity to learn by doing, from simple service to leading worship.

As we put things together and look forward to this season, I’m inspired by the words of 1 Peter 4:10: *“Just as each one has received a gift, use it to serve others, as good stewards of the varied grace of God.”* Let’s use our gifts here at Elim to get out and spread the joy of Jesus! We are not just trying to get through the Bible, but rather to get to know Him. We must give God the chance to reveal more of Himself to us. A relationship cannot grow well if you rely solely on chance meetings; you need to be intentional to make time for the other person.

God's Love Always Wins

THE JOURNEY TO DISCOVERING
A RICH LIFE FILLED WITH CHRIST

“Sammy, you will find out how awesome I am, and you will fear me, and when you fear me, you will obey me, and when you obey me, you will fall in love with me.”

Sitting in the middle of a rehab in Washington D.C., due to a heroin addiction, these were the words that rang so clear in my head as I struggled with the decision to leave or stay in rehab.

At first, these words seemed strange and intimidating. Fear and obedience were not concepts I had associated with love. Life had taught me to run from fear and reject authority. But sitting alone and stripped of the distractions and defenses that had long defined my life, I pondered the deeper meaning of those words.

By the grace of God, I decided to heed His voice and stay in rehab for an additional 13 months. It was in those months that I discovered the “awesomeness” of God. It wasn’t about mountain top experiences or grand miracles, though those could be part of it. It was about recognizing the steady, unchanging presence of a God who had never abandoned me, even in my darkest moments. Through all of the pain, mistakes, and brokenness, God had been there, patiently waiting for me to see His hand at work. I began to see God as the ultimate authority, one whose power and justice were balanced by infinite grace and mercy. This fear wasn’t paralyzing; it was freeing. Obedience didn’t come naturally at first, but



as the days went by, obeying God became less about following rules and more about aligning my life with the One who truly knew what was best for me.

And then came love.

It was gradual and soft, but a love that I have never experienced before. I no longer saw God as a distant, demanding figure but as a loving Father who desired a relationship with me. It was this relationship that would open the doors for me to attend ELIM, become a Pastor, and use my story to reach the lost and make disciples.

We may not all sit in a rehab center debating surrender, but we all face moments when we must decide whether to trust God fully. His invitation remains the same to you as it was to me: discover His greatness, stand in awe of Him, walk in obedience, and ultimately fall in love with Him.

For those struggling to take that first step. Remember God meets us right where we are, even in the most unlikely places. He speaks words that challenge us, but they are always rooted in love and when we respond to His call, we find a life richer and more beautiful than we ever imagined. I found that out and so can you.

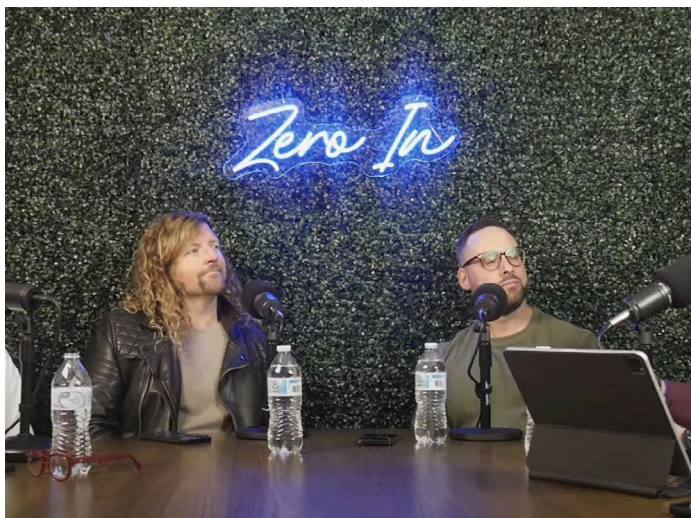


exhortation emboldened students, staff, faculty, and visitors alike.

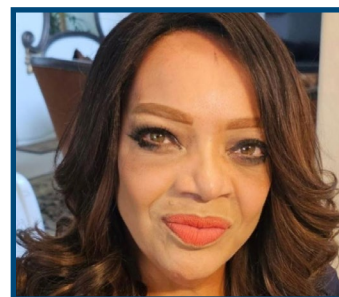
